Pick up arrangements

Y6 independent travellers will require written permission to travel home from school.

Please ensure your child is aware who is picking them up each morning.

Written permission is required if another parent will be collecting your child. Please send this in on the morning in question.

Children, their Uniform and Equipment

We expect every child to be dressed in correct uniform, especially sensible black shoes.
Please note that jewellery and make up are not allowed.

We would be grateful if you could ensure that your child has the following equipment in school:
PE Kit, Reading book, Pencil case – regularly checked and re-stocked.

Please check that labels are still present and readable on clothing items throughout the year.

Spelling

The children will be given a spelling journal which will stay at school. They will be taught strategies and patterns which will enable them to attempt to spell new words correctly in their daily writing. Please encourage your child to regularly practise the spelling patterns.

Reading Records

All children should read daily at home. Reading books can be changed when a book has been read, re-read and understood.

Reading is not a race, it should be enjoyed; questions and 'book talk' is crucial in ensuring our children have understood what they have read.

You can always supplement your child's school reading book with something else: magazines, comics, classic books, Non-fiction books, kindles.

Reading records are checked every Friday.
