## MMR Immunisations

Please see the letter that was sent out earlier today from the Barnet Immunisation Team regarding the alarming rise in measles cases which is being reported across the UK.

Advice from the NHS states that 9 out of 10 unvaccinated children can catch measles if just one other pupil in their class has it.

Can we also remind you of the need to keep your child at home following a vomiting incident, regardless of what you believe the cause to be? A child should not return to school until 48 hours after their last vomiting or diarrhoea incident. We are having to send pupils home who have been sent back to school too early following being ill.

This is to protect the rest of the class, including staff, from picking up any possible bugs
