



St Andrew's CE Primary School – Pupil Premium Planned Spend for 2020/21

The Pupil Premium is a sum of money in the school's budget. It is allocated according to the number of children who are looked after or eligible for free school meals. It is intended to support schools in narrowing the gaps in attainment between different groups of pupils.

Key objectives:

1. Continue to narrow the attainment gap for progress and attainment in core subjects across all key stages – reading, writing and mathematics
2. To provide catch-up interventions where pupils may have gaps in their attainment due to lockdown 1.
3. Provide extra support to children who have emotional and behaviour difficulties and support for vulnerable families extending our offer of learning for parents
4. Provide our children with equal access to the enrichment opportunities provided in our Curriculum through 'launch' visits/visitors and residential visits.
