

# Animals' Needs for Survival



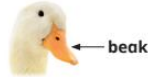
## Mammals

- **mammal** – an animal with fur or hair on its body
- **fur** – the fine, soft hair found on different animals
- **carnivore** – an animal that eats other animals
- **herbivore** – an animal that eats plants
- **omnivore** – an animal that eats plants and other animals



## Birds

- **bird** – an animal with feathers, wings and a beak
- **feathers** – the soft covering on the outside of birds
- **beak** – a bird's mouth and nose
- **insect** – an animal with six legs
- **wing** – a part of a bird's body which some use to fly



## Fish

- **fish** – an animal with fins, gills and scales that lives in water
- **scales** – small, hard layers that grow from the skin
- **gills** – the part of the body that fish use to breathe
- **fin** – a thin part that sticks out from the fish to help it swim and stay balanced



## Amphibians

- **amphibian** – an animal that can live on land and in water
- **webbed feet** – feet with toes that are joined together to help with swimming
- **frog** – an amphibian with moist, smooth skin
- **toad** – an amphibian with dry, bumpy skin
- **newt** – an amphibian with a long tail



## Reptiles

- **reptile** – an animal with dry scales on its body
- **scales** – small, hard layers that grow from the skin
- **carnivore** – an animal that eats other animals
- **herbivore** – an animal that eats plants
- **omnivore** – an animal that eats plants and other animals



## Humans

- **mammal** – an animal with fur or hair on its body
- **adult** – a fully grown human
- **baby** – a newborn human
- **shelter** – a place that gives protection from weather and danger
